- Conduct psychological assessments and provide meaningful recommendations to inform educational and social programming.

- Provide intervention to individual students and groups (i.e., individual therapy, conflict resolution, peer mediation, social skills, emotional regulation).
- Offer professional development activities focused on evidence-based practices to staff at Summit School.

- PhD in School or Clinical Psychology (or approaching completion of the program).
- Membership in the Ordre des psychologues du Québec is an asset.
- High Level of empathy, care, and sensitivity to the needs of the students.
- Experience and interest in working with neurodiverse students, a strong work ethic, showing good initiative, independence and an ability to work effectively as part of a team are essential for the position.
- Excellent oral & written communication skills in English along with solid interpersonal skills.
- Knowledge of French is an asset.
