

Summit School's Psychology Department provides clinical practicums to graduate students registered in School/ Applied Child Psychology and Clinical Psychology doctoral training programs. Interns have the opportunity to work with neurodiverse students across our varied clinical setting within the context of a multidisciplinary team. Internship students will gain experience in adapting their skills in psychological assessment, behavioural consultation and intervention, and counselling to the unique needs of our students with the goal of providing a neurodiversity affirming approach. Depending on the needs of the student, therapeutic modalities including play therapy, cognitive behavior therapy, and group intervention approaches are used to develop students' self-awareness, emotional regulation, social skills and coping skills. The interests of the clinical intern will be taken into account in collaboratively planning the objectives of the internship experience.

Interested applicants should submit a curriculum vitae as well as a letter of intent outlining what you are hoping to achieve through an internship at Summit School. References must also be available upon request. Please submit your application by January 10, 2025.
